



Mike Dulaney has been involved with the Cincinnati Zoo & Botanical Garden for over 40 years, getting his start at an early age following keepers and curators around the zoo. He spent 22 years as an animal keeper in various departments of the zoo until 1995 when he became part of the curatorial team that manages the Zoo's diverse animal collection. He currently serves as the Curator of Mammals. Mike has traveled extensively to photograph wildlife both in zoos and their natural habitats. Many of his photographs have been used in Cincinnati Zoo educational material and several have appeared in wildlife books. Born and raised in Cincinnati he now resides in Northern Kentucky.

Mike has been escorting Zoo trips since 1989 and has visited Kenya and Tanzania several times as well as Uganda, Namibia, South Africa, the island of Komodo, Borneo and the Peruvian Amazon. He is a Professional Fellow in the American Association of Zoos and Aquariums, is the Subspecies Coordinator for the Malayan Tiger Species Survival Plan program and serves as the Cincinnati Zoo's Institutional Representative for many other Species Survival Plan programs.
